And these weigh on none more heavily than the shoulders of the president. It is almost with certainty that no one would want to be in his shoes at this time.

We may not personally be facing problems or crises of such magnitude, but it often feels like it, doesn't it? The world that we have carefully built begins to crumble, and cracks in our soul begin to

show. Desperation leads to throwing all sanity aside. Disgust overtakes respect for others and verbal attacks are aimed at those in position in an attempt to oust them from office. paid a hefty price at times. But he did remind himself to call upon the Lord each time he was swallowed up by his giants. And always, God faithfully delivered him.

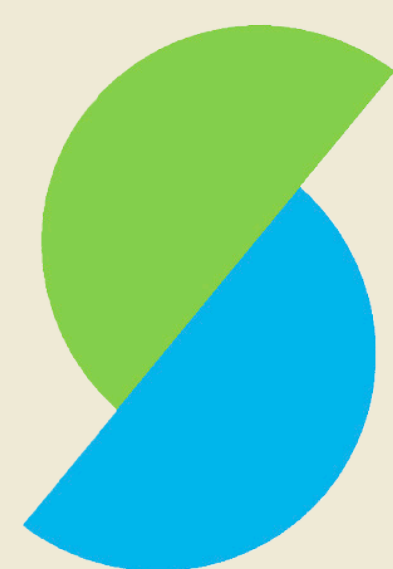
