SERMON OUTLINE

KNOW THE LORD OUR GOD

EXODUS 5:22-6:27 | REV. LITO VILLORIA

When life gets extremely difficult, when our hearts are weighed down heavily, and when our minds are battling frustrations, we tend to doubt the wisdom of God. And sometimes, we blame God for everything!

When the foremen of Israel angrily confronted Moses and Aaron, Moses was severely affected emotionally. His heart became heavy. In his frustration, he questioned the wisdom of the LORD and charged Him of doing evil to the people of Israel (Exodus 5:22-23).

The LORD assured Moses He would deliver Israel with His great power. He reminded Moses of who He was and what He could do for them. He appeared to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob as the God Almighty ("El Shaddai" - the Great Provider). But now, He revealed Himself to them as the Great I AM and the "God of I Will" (Exodus 6:1-8).

After being assured and affirmed of who God is and what He can do, Moses went back to the people of Israel with a renewed spirit. But Moses was met with the same resistance. The suffering of the people was so severe that their initial response of worship turned to rejection of God, His message, and His

messenger (Exodus 6:9; 4:30-31).

The LORD reiterated His command for Moses and Aaron to bring the people of Israel out of Egypt. Moses reasoned out to God that if the people of Israel had not listened to him, how much more Pharaoh. Nevertheless, the LORD commanded them to do as He had said (Exodus 6:10-13).

The genealogy of Moses and Aaron most likely was intended to identify their roots. This revealed their authority to represent the people of Israel before Pharaoh (Exodus 6:14-27).

In this sermon, we will learn the best response to when life gets difficult, when our hearts are weighed down, and when we battle frustrations is to seek to know the LORD our God—know who He is and what He can do for you! ✠
