## THE BRIDE MADE READY

REVELATION 19:6-10

Ifter a series of events that shook the earth at its core, the apostle John was given a glorious vision in

Revelation 19:6-8,

"Then I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the roar of many waters and like the sound of mighty peals of thunder, crying out,

"Hallelujah!
For the Lord our God
the Almighty reigns.
Let us rejoice and exult
and give him the glory,
for the marriage of the Lamb has
come,

and his Bride has made herself ready; it was granted her to clothe herself with fine linen, bright and pure"—for the fine linen is the righteous deeds of the saints."

In this portion of Scripture, we are told that multitudes erupted in worship as they witnessed the long-awaited marriage of the Lamb and His bride. This was so glorious that it left John completely overwhelmed.

To make sense of this glorious vision, we must understand that the prophets of old prophesied about this very day, and not just them, but even Jesus himself promised that this day would come!
