## PROCLAIM THE ATTRIBUTES AND GLORY OF GOD

EXODUS 34:1-35 I REV. DONG VILLATITO

Israelites from slavery in Egypt. God protected them and provided for them, established them as a nation, made a covenant with them. But not long after the covenant was ratified, they committed spiritual adultery by worshiping a golden calf, and it caused more than three thousand people to die.

In chapter 33, we see that Moses interceded on their behalf. Moses in his prayer requested God three things:

1. That God would show his ways. (Exodus 33:13a)
2. That God would again consider Israel to be his people. (Exodus 33:13c)
3. And that God would show him his glory. (Exodus 33: 18)

God responded by calling Moses back on top of the mountain but instead of showing Moses His glory, God proclaimed His name and attributes (Exodus 34:5-7). By proclaiming His name, God did not just reveal who He was,

but He revealed the very reason why Israel failed to obey God's commands. The root of their sin was their failure to see and grasp the character and attributes of God. They thought God was someone they could create, manipulate to satisfy their needs and desires. (Exodus 32:1)

In today's message, we will learn the significance of God's attributes and how to respond and imbibe them in our lives. May our lives, indeed, be a reflection of the attributes and glory of God as we proclaim His name to others.\*
