TRUST IN THE GOD OF JACOB

PSALM 146 | ELDER RAYMUND SANCHEZ

The last five psalms of the Psalter are known as Hallel Psalms. That's because they begin with the Hebrew word, "Hallel", from which we get the word Hallelujah, or praise the Lord.

Psalm 146 is the first of these five psalms. It sets forth a dichotomy between the powers and principalities of this world over against the sovereignty of God. It assumes you can't have it both ways; and so, it admonishes us not to put our hope in the things of this world, but to trust God to order and provide. It's a matter of choice.

1. What does it mean to praise the Lord?

2. Why does the Psalmist encourage us to trust the Lord and not in man?

3. Outside of the Lord, in what other sources do we normally trust?

4. The Psalm leads us to a dichotomy where we need to choose to either trust in the Lord or to trust in the world. Have you made your choice? ✱
