## HOPEIS BORN

LUKE 2:1-20 I REV. MIKE TRINIDAD

The birth of Jesus Christ, the Messiah born in a manger to save people from their sins, was eagerly awaited by Joseph and Mary. The shepherds who tended their flocks at night, likewise rejoiced at Jesus' birth, even though their initial reaction was one of fear and terror at the birth of the baby they had heard about in Bethlehem.

Jesus Christ's birth was significant because He is the one who was prophesied about to give hope for all mankind, for those who would receive forgiveness of their sins by receiving Jesus in their hearts and in their lives. Indeed, the birth of Jesus gave hope to people then, as it does so until the present, especially in light of the current pandemic. People have had to cope with seemingly insurmountable and very difficult challenges that have caused many to become desperate and despondent.
