"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:

<sup>5</sup> a time to cast away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing;

<sup>6</sup> a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to cast away;

<sup>7</sup> a time to tear, and a time to sew;

a time to keep silence, and a time to speak;

<sup>8</sup> a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace."

For everything there is a season, a time for everything. This passage shows us the reality of life, that there is an appropriate occasion for every human event. It shows us two sides of every story, a contrast as seen in the series of positive and negative events written. Our life is not all about the good things that we experience but it is also not all about the bad. This is the reason why we hear of people describing life as like a roller coaster, full of ups and downs, twists and turns. It can be scary, but it can also be fun. However, at the end of the day, just like the roller coaster ride, one will not always remain on top or at the bottom.
