The other thing I learned is to trust God's work and keep on praying. Prayer played a big role in my experience. Every time we met, we would end our time praying for each other's prayer requests. Likewise, I would pray for an opportunity to share the gospel, and from time to time I would pray that his heart would soften and he would surrender to the Lord. And, even though there was seemingly no progress through the years, the Lord always led me to trust His unseen work (at least in my eyes) every time. In summary, trust God's work and keep on praying!

As we press on in showing and sharing the love and the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, my prayer is that we would grow in trusting God's whens and keep on persevering, and in trusting God's works and keep on praying.
