SERMON OUTLINE

OUR HOLY GOD

PSALM 99 PASTOR JONAR GARCIA

Psalm 99 is a call to praise God by celebrating God's kingship over all his creation. The focus of the psalm is God's holiness, which we can see in verses 3, 5, and 9 God's holiness involves God's holiness involves both moral purity and distinction from His creatures. God is holy in how He reigns, rules, and responds to His people.

"Holy," which in both Hebrew and Greek has the root meaning of separateness or being set-apart. It is used predominantly in Scripture

for separation from sin.
But this is only a secondary
meaning derived from
the primary application of
God's separateness from all creation.

I divided the psalm into three (3) divisions: 1) the holy God who reigns with great power; 2) the holy God who rules with righteousness; and 3) the holy God who responds to His people. God's reign implies His absolute power (v. 1a), His authority to rule (v. 1b), and His awesome name that is to be worshiped (vv. 2-3).

The Lord's ruling in righteousness implies the following: 1) He is holy in how He executes justice, therefore, His judgments are perfect; 2) He also knows what is in our hearts,

therefore, we cannot fool Him; 3) we can also run to Him because His judgments are right and just; and finally, 4) our rightful response to Him is worship. The Lord not only reigns with great power, He rules in righteousness, but He responds to His people by responds to His people by answering their prayers, protecting and guiding them, and forgiving His people.

God is holy. He cannot be compared to other "gods". He is without sin.

Let's be reminded that we have a holy God who reigns, rules, and responds to His people. Therefore, we must fear Him, worship Him, and live holy lives pleasing to Him.₩

For example, if you were born in January, your offering goes into the January basket. If your birthday is in February, find the basket labeled February, and so on.

If you cannot be with us in person, you can make a bank transfer. However, we highly encourage everyone to join us at GCF South Metro for corporate worship.

Allow me to give you four reasons we can give thanks to the Lord:

1. Give thanks to the Lord for His

We are to make sure that we are focused on the person of God. If we are to do something significant, it has to always be focused on who God is. Because if we lose focus on God, what we do will not be more significant. The best way to begin giving thanks to God is in the person of God.

2. Give thanks to the Lord for His Presence.
